Reuniting Children With Their Incarcerated Parents By: Dr. Rafael Alalu, Prison Reform Advocate

Millions of U.S. children are separated from a parent each year because of parental incarceration in prison or jail. The re-entry reunification process can be challenging for both the children and the returning citizen. This article will focus on what can be done to make this burden easier on the entire process.

A key component of the post-release period is the prevention of parental recidivism. Approximately two thirds of state prisoners were rearrested and more than half returned to prison within 3 years of release (Durose, Cooper, & Snyder, 2014). The high recidivism rates have implications for young children's well-being. Many services and support are needed to make the reentry period successful. Reentering individuals who receive planning assistance have more successful reentry experiences, including lower recidivism rates (La Vigne, Davies, Palmer, & Halberstadt, 2008). Reentry planning should begin as soon as the individual is incarcerated, and it should also include the family.

There are many ways to support children, reentering parents, caregivers, and extended family as they reunite following parental incarceration. Adjustment to reunification is smoother when access to services and supports occur during incarceration as well as the reentry period. Furthermore, it is essential to eliminate systemic racism and economic inequities to ensure that young children with incarcerated parents are not subject to the same negative forces as their parents.












JUNE
