



MOTHER'S DAY AND NATURE

Life Skills: Emotional intelligence, social interaction, thankfulness, responsibility for the environment.

To celebrate their mothers and caregivers, the children headed to Aguacate Sanctuary to paint, decorate, and fill flower pots as gifts to show love and appreciation.

Afterwards, they were able to explore everything the sanctuary had to offer by feeding the animals, and learning about nature, wellness, and the Japanese art of "kintsugi", the art of repairing broken pots.

Our mothers and caregivers were also taught about the importance of health and nutrition. Photography was also introduced to the children, and many of the photos from this event were taken by them!

MAY 20, 2023

CREATE AND BUILD: ENGINEERING DAY

Life Skills: Problem-solving, critical thinking, initiative, curiosity, self-confidence.

The children came together to map out cities and create their own bridge models using various craft materials after two engineers came to speak about their jobs and career-related possibilities. This activity allowed them to apply engineering principles of science and mathematics to solve real world problems and innovate new products.

The children then concocted slime mixtures made with cornstarch to learn about chemical reactions. It promoted hands-on sensory play and exploring different materials.





MUSEUM OF DISCOVERY AND SCIENCE

Life Skills: Imagination, discovery, and future possibilities

At the Museum of Discovery and Science's "Expedition: Dinosaur!" the kids dove deep to discover their inner paleontologist. By using cutting-edge technology, the exhibit gave kids the chance to interact with real-life animatronic dinosaurs and fascinating prehistoric information. Numerous additional interactive exhibits at the museum kept their interest while teaching kids about the significance of science in daily life. They had the chance to fly through wide skies, travel over limitless red landscapes of Mars, and experience the art and science of flying thanks to an immersive aviation museum and flight simulator. They had the opportunity to explore not just what was in space, but also what was underwater thanks to the aquarium exhibit.
























JUNE 25, 2023

AUGUST 21, 2023

WHERE ARE THE CHILDREN? PODCAST

Our featured guest for this episode of "Where Are the Children" is Gus Castellamos, MD, a retired Neurologist. He has since been a practitioner of mindfulness and teaching mindfulness-based stress reduction and mindulness-based attention training since 2009. Along with our amazing hosts Paulette "Tinkerbell" Pfeiffer, Midia Joy, and Weslye Saunders, Gus discusses the true meaning of mindfulness and its application to the Bureau of Prisons and children visiting their incarcerated parents.

AUGUST 27, 2023

POTTERY CLASS

Skills: The art of creative thinking, emotional intelligence, and ceramics.

The children were able to make full use of their hands during this event at Mercy Pottery, a ceramics workshop. The activities involved clay, paint, pottery wheels, and photography. They were given animal figurines to design and paint. They were also able to experience the therapeutic art of pottery classes. Similar to all of our other events, the cameras were brought, so the children could continue honing their photography skills.



SPEAKING ENGAGEMENTS

A big part of SVC is spreading awareness about the issue of children of prisoners through speaking engagements and advocacy efforts. We have had the opportunity to train principals and mental health professionals from Miami-Dade School District and speak to students at Florida International University. We also spoke at NAAWS in Columbus, Ohio in front of over 300 Wardens and Superintendents from across the country.

Some of our future engagements include presenting at the International Prisoners Family Conference and heading to Lost Creek, Kentucky with correctional personnel to rebuild a playground and ballpark that was destroyed by a devastating flood. Now the children can play again! (Volunteers welcome!)
